August 20, 1968

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on August 20, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor Flanary presiding.

Present: V.O. Flanary, G.E. Hunnicutt, C.W. Bryant, R.L. Collins, S.H. Neeley

Also Present: Robert Stump & Leslie Mullins, Attorneys

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A group of merchants from Greater Norton, Inc., with Bob Isaac as spokesman, #4491 appeared before Council to discuss problems of parking in the City. Mr. Kidd and Mr. Tate also spoke expressing the feelings of the merchants that something should be done immediately to provide more parking. They urged Council strongly to cooperate. Mr. Kidd advised Council that during his ten years as merchant in Norton, nothing has been done to improve this situation. Council discussed at length, stating that they realize the problems, and that this is included in the planning study now in preliminary procedures. J.C. and Edward Holcomb were called in to discuss with Council possibility of purchase of St. Charles Hotel property for parking purposes. Mr. Charlie Daniels, Chairman of Planning Commission was called in to report on preliminary plans for the planning of City of Norton. On motion by G.E. Hunnicutt, seconded by S.H. Neeley and carried by unanimous vote, Council moved that a committee be appointed to negotiate with the Holcombs and contiguous property owners and any other property owners of feasible property. Mayor Flanary appointed the following committee to serve: G.E. Hunnicutt, Robert Isaac, Lestie Mullins and Charlie Daniels.

Mr. Amburn, Manager of the Parks-Belk Store, appeared before Council requesting a stop signal at corner of 9th and Park Avenue. Council advised him that #4492 this matter is being studied.

Mr. Forrest Lunsford appeared before Council protesting the \$50.00 license for trading pistols at the stock market. Attorney Stump advised of present provision of Code imposing this license. Mr. Goad, Mr. Burgart, Mr. Burchette, Mr. Stewart spoke in favor of something being done in order to keep the stock market a part of the City.

After discussion and on motion by G.E. Hunnicutt, seconded by R.L. Collins and carried by unanimous vote, Council moved that Section No. 108. A of the License Tax Code of the City of Norton be amended so as the cost of said license to read \$5.00 per annum instead of \$50.00

On motion by S.H. Neeley, seconded by C.W. Bryant and carried by unanimous #4494 vote, Council moved that the paving bid of White Excavating Company be accepted in the amount of \$16,162.10.

Mayor Flanary reported to Council his correspondence with State Highway

Department regarding salvaging of material on Kentucky Avenue project for upgrading other streets in Norton.

On motion by S.H. Neeley, seconded by C.W. Bryant and carried by unanimous #4496 vote, Council moved the adoption of the Lenowisco report.

On motion by G.E. Hunnicutt, seconded by S.H. Neeley and carried by unanimous #4497 vote, Council moved that the matter of damage to car be referred to City Manager.

The matter of hiring a meter man was referred to City Manager.
