

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on October 4, 1966 at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor Flanary presiding.

Present: V.O. Flanary, G.E. Hunnicutt, C.W. Bryant, S.H. Neeley

Absent: R.L. Collins

Also Present: David Norman, City Manager & Bob Stump, Attorney

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mrs. J.T. Greear of 840 Laurel Avenue appeared before council regarding extension of water and sewer lines to her property. She also spoke regarding the condition 3801 of the road. The City Manager advised council that in order to extend water line a pump would have to be installed since this is above the water level. After a lengthy discussion and upon motion by S.H. Neeley, seconded by C.W. Bryant and carried by unanimous vote council instructed the city manager to look into this matter thoroughly and make detailed estimate of cost to put in water line and to see what can be done regarding installing of sewer line.

Mr. Cowden of Roberts Avenue appeared before council regarding condition of alley between Roberts Avenue and Kentucky Avenue going off Sixth Street. He stated he 3802 had appeared before council approximately 5 months ago regarding same matter. The City Manager advised council that the alley had been graded. Matter referred to City Manager to look into further.

Charlie Hicks of 605 Ky. Avenue appeared before council regarding the above alley. He also requested that something be done regarding water running from this alley into his basement. Referred to City Manager. Mr. Hicks also inquired as to status 3803 of Kentucky Avenue.

Mr. Norman presented bids on Kentucky Avenue. Pope Paving Company being low bidder of \$1,050.00.

On motion by G.E. Hunnicutt, seconded by S.H. Neeley and carried by unanimous vote council moved on recommendation of City Manager to accept bid of Pope 3804 Paving Company for Kentucky Avenue, said bid in amount of \$1,050.00.

Mayor Flanary discussed with council the final plans for motorcade to Cumberland Gap. It was decided that the motorcade would leave Norton at 12 o'clock. 3805

Attorney Stump read proposed dog ordinance. Dr. J.T. Phillips, Mr. & Mrs. Cecil Gardner, George Bolling and R.C. Hubbard each expressed their view on this proposed ordinance. It was their consensus of opinion, that this ordinance was too severe. After a very lengthy discussion and upon motion by G.E. Hunnicutt, seconded by S.H. Neeley and carried by unanimous vote council moved that a second alternative ordinance be prepared by City Attorney to be considered by the Council at its next meeting. 3806 Such ordinance to enforce such laws as already on books, to reenact the statutes, to respect a man's right to have a dog and to respect man's right not to have a dog; that every dog shall have one bite, a bite shall be determined as a literal bite or a violation of the property of another then that person transgressed upon shall make a complaint. This complaint will be investigated and if valid the owner of the animal will be warned. Should there be a second transgression then the owner will be required to chain the animal or otherwise put him up. Any further violation will constitute a misdemeanor on the part of the owner.

There was no vote on proposed dog ordinance read by Attorney Stump.

Mayor Flanary appointed the following as members of Annexation study Commission: 3807  
W.P. Kanto, John Litton and David B. Norman.

Mr. Norman discussed with council smoke abatement program. City Council instructed the City Manager to take up this matter with proper state authorities. 3808.

A discussion of city owned property on Park Avenue was held. The City Manager and City Attorney were instructed to check into this matter further with N.&W. 3809


Mr. Norman discussed with council moving parking meters and of installing meters on Park Avenue between 10th & 11th Street. Council approved installing of parking meters between 10th & 11th Street on Park Avenue in lieu of traffic regulations. 3810

Jim Sommerville appeared before council and discussed "Demonstration Cities Program". Council instructed the city manager to investigate this further. 3811

Councilman Hunnicutt brought to council's attention the necessity of council's appointing a new Norton Industrial Development Commission. 3812
