

April 5, 1960

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on the above date at 7:30 P. M. with Mayor B. E. Ball presiding.

Present: F. E. Ball, Sol Cury, W. R. Hamner
Absent: Fred King, F. W. Glass

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Dr. R. W. Jessee appeared before council to discuss rabid animals and the passage of an ordinance regarding same. #1636

On motion by Sol Cury, seconded by W. R. Hamner and carried by unanimous roll call vote, the following ordinance relative to Dogs Running at Large was passed:

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF NORTON, VIRGINIA:

(1) That it shall be unlawful for any dog to run at large for a period of forty-five (45) days from this date, and the owner or owners of all dogs shall keep the same confined on their premises unless leashed under restraint of the owner in such a manner that persons or animals will not be subject to the danger of being bitten thereby.

(2) It shall be the duty of the Police Department to enforce the provisions of this law.

(3) Any persons found guilty of a violation of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and subject to a fine of not less than Five Dollars nor more than Twenty-Five Dollars for each violation.

An emergency existing, this ordinance shall be effective April 14, 1960.

Dr. J. T. Phillips appeared before council requesting again that something be done about the drain across his property on Highland Avenue. The council agreed to construct an 18" drain along the north line of his property from Henry Street to Highland Avenue at a cost to him of \$300.00. #1637

Mr. C. T. Riddle appeared before council requesting that investigation be made of the possibility of cleaning the Guest River near the Virginia Supply Company. Referred to City Manager. #1638

Mr. W. P. Kanto appeared before council to discuss with council the proposed School Budget for the ensuing year. A brief discussion followed. #1639

Mr. Norton reported that he had met with the Little League Officials and had agreed to do the work which they requested. #1640


