

Sept. 6, 1960

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on the above date at 7:30 P. M. with Mayor B. E. Ball presiding.

Present: B. E. Ball, F. W. Glass, W. R. Hamner, J. C. Holcomb, Sol Cury.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Rev. Ray Gardner appeared before council to ask when city water would #1731 be put to his property. He was advised that this would be done as soon as possible.

On motion by A. O. Umstead, seconded by Clarence Holcomb and carried #1732 by unanimous roll call vote, an Ordinance to Fix the Amount of Water Deposits, Penalties for Non-Payment of water Bills, and Service Charges was passed on second reading.

The following stated they were going to attend the League Convention, #1733 Sept. 18th, 19th and 20th: Mr. & Mrs. B. E. Ball, Mr. & Mrs. W. R. Hamner, Mr. & Mrs. J. C. Holcomb, Mr. & Mrs. F. W. Glass and Mr. & Mrs. Evan Norton.

The City Manager presented the 1959-60 audit for study by the council. #1734

Miss Sarah Dollarhyde appeared before council to ask that the steps #1735 from 10th up to her property be cleaned. She was advised that this would be taken care of.

Mr. Norton presented a taxi driver's application for Harold L. Hall #1736 On motion by A. O. Umstead, seconded by F. W. Glass, the taxi driver's permit was withheld pending further investigation by the City Manager, indicating the place he plans to operate from and with who he is to be associated.

After the discussion of a letter from Hayes, Seay, Mattern and #1737 Mattern regarding the cost of sewage disposal plant - on a motion by W. R. Hamner, seconded by F. W. Glass and carried by unanimous roll call vote the following resolution was duly adopted.

Be It Resolved that the second paragraph of the resolution adopted on June 21, 1960 be rescinded and declared for naught, and that the date for holding a referendum on the issuance of bonds be delayed until the further consideration of the council.

On motion by F. W. Glass, seconded by Clarence Holcomb and carried #1738 by unanimous roll call vote, the City Manager was instructed to change the school signs to indicate a speed limit of 15 miles per hour on Virginia Avenue between 10th and 11th Streets, up Pine Street and the streets bordening the grade school, and to check the Model Traffic Ordinance before doing so to determine if this was already covered by the ordinance.

There being no further business before the council same adjourned.
