Mr. Ramey also handed to the members of Council and the City Attorney a copy of a proposal sent by e-mail to the City by another company requesting to place three antennas on this tank for the same purpose of providing the City with wireless services.

He went over the financial aspects, construction, job growth, special events, and other opportunities that have occurred or will occur in the near future at the Hotel Norton. He
