

The regular meeting of the Norton City Council was held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building on Tuesday, December 1, 1992 at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Raines presiding.

Present: Roy Roberts, Jack Wallace, Robert Raines, William Mays, and Ron McCall

Also Present: E. W. Ward, City Manager and Joe Pippin, City Attorney

The invocation was given by Father Tom Collins and was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance which was led by Assistant City Manager Fred Ramey.

Upon a motion by William Mays, seconded by Roy Roberts, and passed by unanimous vote, Council moved to adopt the minutes of the November 17, 1992 meeting as presented. 15546

There was no response to the Mayor's call for visitors. 15547

Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Armentrout, had requested from Council the amount of \$1,500 to help defray traveling expenses of the John I. Burton High School Girls Basketball Team to the State Playoffs. This is the first time in history that the girls basketball team has gone to State Playoffs.

Upon a motion by Ron McCall, seconded by Jack Wallace, and passed by unanimous roll call vote, Council authorized \$1,500 to come from the Contingency Fund to go to the John I. Burton High School Girls Basketball Team to help defray their traveling expenses to the State Playoffs. 15548

3. Following the Parade, the City will hold its' tree lighting in the City Park at approximately 7:30 p.m.


There were no comments from either the City Attorney or members of Council. 15550
