

November 6, 1952

The Town Council of the Town of Norton met on the above date in the temporary municipal building at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor B.E. Ball presiding.

All members of the Council were present and answered to the roll call.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Mayor ask for report of committees, after which Mr. Umstead, Chairman of a committee appointed to make a survey of traffic conditions, presented his report.

On motion made and duly seconded it was moved that the report of the traffic committee be accepted with any changes agreed upon by the town manager and committee with the addition of three signs, Ramsey, West Norton, Esserville reading "STRICTLY ENFORCED" and that the manager be empowered to carry out any final recommendations of the committee.

On motion made and duly seconded the town manager was authorized to make a traffic check for the purpose of one way street study.

On motion made and duly seconded it was moved that the two hour parking signs be removed at once.

The Mayor appointed Mr. King as an additional member of the committee to study the traffic problems in town and that the remaining members of the old committee remain.

Applications for on-off premise beer licenses from Paul Bullion, T/A as Paul's Pastry Shop and of Haskell Mullins, T/A Oak Grove Tourist Court were read and upon motion made and duly seconded were approved.

A discussion of the closing of pool rooms on Sunday was held.

By a motion made and duly seconded the town attorney was authorized to prepare an ordinance to cover the closing of pool rooms on Sunday.

A letter from L. & N. Railroad Company was read asking the Town of Norton not to participate in the suit to keep the passenger train service to Norton.

On motion made and duly seconded the matter of the L. & N. Railroad was deferred until the next council meeting and the town attorney was instructed to check into the matter before said meeting.

#75

Request from Doc Tamer for street light on Chestnut Street between 8th Street and Ridge Avenue was read. No action taken.

#76

Mr. McCord gave a report regarding the water shortage after which a lengthy discussion followed and on motion made and duly seconded the town manager and Mr. Umstead were authorized to procur water to supply the system.

There being no further business before the council same adjourned.
