## Camping Area

Open April 1—October 30

- 17 single units
- Each unit has a parking spur, tent pad, wooden picnic table, and fire pit w/ grill
- Hot water showers
- Flush toilets
- Central water fountains
- Trailer waste disposal station
- Camping fee: \$20 per night with electricity

## Flag Rock Recreation Area

Flag Rock Recreation Area is also known as "Norton's Mountain Masterpiece". It boasts 25 developed acres, which includes our Flag Rock Overlook. Aptly named after Karl Matuszczyk, a German immigrant, planted an American Flag on this large rock outcrop in the 1920's. Flag Rock was dedicated in 1974 and opened on June 12, 1976. The view from Flag Rock Overlook affords a panoramic view of downtown Norton and the surrounding area.

## Rules and Regulations



- Please pay camping fee at pay station
- Visitors/Quiet hours are allowed from 6:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m.
- Pets must be kept on a leash not exceeding six feet in length
- Camping on undesignated areas is prohibited
- Length of stay is limited to 14 consecutive days
- Alcoholic beverages are prohibited
- Discharge of grey water and sewage is prohibited, please use dump station
- Fires must be confined in designated fire rings or grills
- Campsites may not exceed 8 people and 3 motorized vehicles

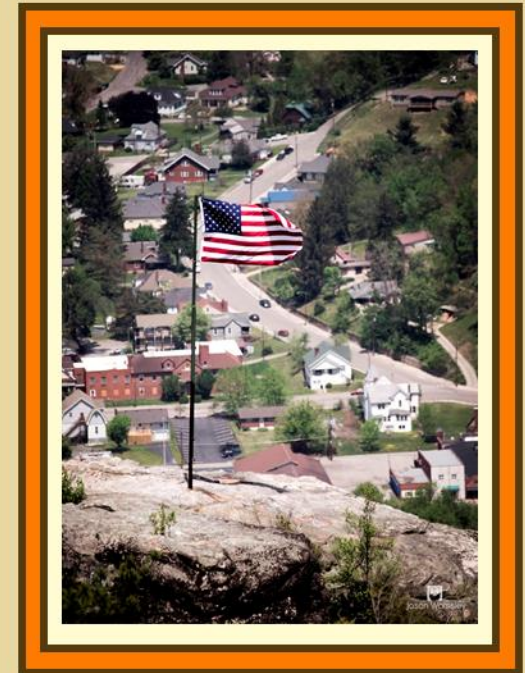
The Flag Rock Recreation Area is located on Rt. 619, three miles above the City of Norton.

## Flag Rock

Norton's Mountainous recreation area affords the visitor a look at the city from an airy overlook, more than 1000 feet above the city. While admiring a view from the overlook, visitors can also snap a quick picture with the Woodbooger. In October 2014 the City of Norton passed a resolution declaring the city a sanctuary for the ape-like creature.



Numerous picnic tables are scattered among unusual rock outcroppings. Rental shelters are located in the center of the recreation area. Shelter #1 has a large covered grill area, a fireplace, electricity and water. Shelter #2 has the same amenities except for a smaller grill area. Both shelters are within walking distance to restroom facilities. Children are happy to find playground equipment at the site as well as a field for recreation activities.

Rental fees for the large shelters are due when the activity is scheduled. Rates are : \$50 per shelter per day.
