

The regular meeting of the City Council was held in the Municipal Court Room on September 5, 1972 at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor Woods presiding.

Present: Archie Woods, Ike Fultz, Robert Leonard, W.F. McElroy, Jim Humphrey

Also Present: Milas D. Franks, City Manager

Minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

Mr. Ben Mason appeared before council requesting water extension to his property on Laurel Avenue. He pointed out to council the need for this extension in this area and also that he understood the City was removing a pump from Henry Street after new water system was put into operation. The City Manager advised that the pump referred to would be available and if installed would enable them to have water at higher levels on Laurel Avenue. 6115

Mrs. J.T. Greear also spoke regarding water to this section. Matter referred to City Manager for cost study on the project and report back to council at next meeting.

Mr. Charlie Patterson of Locust Avenue appeared before council regarding road to his property. Mr. Sloce also spoke on this matter regarding same street which leads to their church which is now almost completed. Council discussed this street with residents of that section present and referred matter to city manager for study and report back to council meeting. 6116

A group of Citizens from section above new elementary school with Phillip Adams as spokesman appeared before council presenting a petition for water extension to their property. Council discussed this matter with residents of this area who were present and instructed the City Manager to check into this matter with regard to placing an assessment against property for water extension cost. 6117

Mr. Franks presented rough draft of animal & fowl ordinance. Council instructed the city manager to put ordinance in final type and then a decision would be made regarding advertising for public hearing. 6118

Mr. Franks advised council he again had been turned down by Highway Department in request for Traffic Signal at entrance of new elementary school. Council discussed this matter briefly after which the city manager was instructed to take this matter up with Highway Safety Commission to see what they might be able to do on the matter. 6119

Mr. Franks presented request for increase in water meter deposits. On motion by Jim Humphreys, seconded by W.F. McElroy and carried by unanimous roll call vote council moved that the following ordinance be adopted, (Page 14) regarding water meter deposits. 6120

Mr. Franks discussed with council water billing in business district. On motion by Jim Humphrey, seconded by Ike Fultz and carried by unanimous vote council moved that water billing for business district, Trailer Parks & Apartment Buildings be put on once a month billing as outlined by City Manager. 6121

Mr. Franks presented suggested amendment to City Landfill Ordinance. He also presented brochure on tire cutter. Council discussed this matter briefly. No definite action taken. 6122

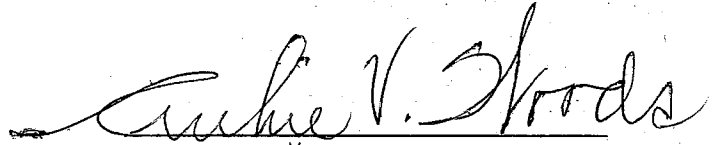
Councilman Fultz inquired as to whether or not the City Manager had found out anything regarding mail carrier service on Spring Avenue. 6123

On motion by Jim Humphrey, seconded by Ike Fultz and carried by unanimous vote the following resolution was passed:

RESOLVED, that Emmett Wampler shall hereafter serve in the capacity as "duly authorized representative" of Earle Brown who has heretofore been designated as "Building Official" under all of the building codes of the City of Norton; and

RESOLVED, that the said Emmett Wampler shall act in said capacity as the "Duly Authorized Representative" of said Building Official until his successor is appointed by the Council of the City of Norton.

There being no further business to come before the council same adjourned.
