The rescheduled meeting of the Norton City Council was held on Wednesday, October 5, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. with Mayor William Mays presiding.

The invocation was given by Father Tim Drake and was followed by the pledge of allegiance led by Councilman Terry Roop.

Upon a motion by Councilman Roop, seconded by Councilman Fawbush, and passed by unanimous vote, Council moved to adopt the minutes of the September 20, 2011 meeting as presented.

There was no response to the Mayor's call for visitors.

Mr. Ward advised Council that the City has a combined total capacity of 86.4 million gallons of water as of September 29<sup>th</sup>. He advised that we had purchased 21.4 million gallons of water from the Wise County Public Service Authority and that the amount paid for this water will be reimbursed by USDA-Rural Development.

Recent pictures were shown of the work done on the Upper Norton Dam Reservoir Project and Mr. Ward advised there had been good productivity. The spillway is progressing and the retaining walls on the sides are going up. The project is proceeding and the Administration is very pleased with the progress.

Council had a request by Norton Community Hospital and Mountain States Health Alliance to approve a resolution for the issuance of bonds to refund prior debt and finance new health care improvements.

Mr. Mark Leonard, CEO of Norton Community Hospital, spoke briefly to Council seeking Council's permission to refinance bonds and to give Council an update on various projects at the hospital. He advised Council he will answer any questions they may have.

There being no questions from Council for Mr. Leonard, he recognized Mr. Steve Salyer, Chief Financial Officer of Norton Community Hospital, who advised Council that the present fixed rate on the bonds in question is 5-1/2%. If they refinance, the rate will be 1.2% saving them \$500,000 to \$600,000 annually.

The City Attorney advised he had reviewed the documents and that they are simple refinancing documents, and, in his opinion, it is a great deal for the hospital. He further advised that these bonds will be issued with the City's support and they pose no liability to the City.
