Mayor Raines, speaking on behalf of Council, advised that Council appreciated the opportunity to meet with Chairman Sturgill and the members of the NIDA.

Mr. Raines advised that the City had been working for the past two and one-half years on securing a major retail development within the City. During that time, amid a myriad of rumors, the City refrained from comments and worked diligently in a professional and confidential manner on securing this development. Mayor Raines advised that it is his pleasure to announce tonight that a new regional shopping center is planned for development in the northeastern section of the City that will contain several hundred thousand square feet of retail and commercial space and six out-parcels for restaurants and other retail/commercial development.

The Commonwealth Company, based in Knoxville, Tennessee, will develop this project and the anchor tenant of this new development will be a new Wal-Mart Super Center with a scheduled opening in spring of 2005.

Being very excited about the financial and economic benefits this development will bring to the City, the Mayor advised that the City will partner with NIDA and the Commonwealth Company on this development.

Mayor Raines turned the floor over to Mr. Sturgill, Chairman of the NIDA.

Mr. Sturgill advised that NIDA is the development arm of the City and further advised that they have been responsible for several successful developments in the City including the AT&T Relay Center and the Hotel Norton.

He stated that NIDA, along with the City, will partner with the Commonwealth Company on this development.

This partnership, once approved, will include a financial commitment by the City and NIDA. NIDA plans to participate in the construction and/or upgrade of the necessary infrastructure to accommodate this development. They will also participate in the acquisition of certain properties, of which several acres will be retained for future development.

Both City Council and NIDA will be considering approval of the necessary documents that are needed to enter into this partnership in the near future.

At this time, Chairman Sturgill turned the floor over to Mayor Raines.

Mayor Raines advised that both Council and NIDA continue their support for this project and, by consensus, are instructing the City Administration to continue working on this project to ensure its success. They also expect to discuss and approve in the near future details surrounding a formal commitment by the City and NIDA.
